# **Major description**

The Languages major consists of courses in both French and Spanish, covering topics such language, literature and culture, as well as a third language such as German, Japanese, Korean or Mandarin. The language courses are designed to improve skills in reading, composition and oral communication, and foster critical analysis of cultural material and intercultural understanding. The language-learning aspect of the program covers practical skills and daily application of both languages, as well as skills that are transferable to a work environment and an academic setting.

# **Getting Started**

# **Preparing for Graduation and Your Future**

Fourth-year+ standing

Explore the Okanagan School of Education's 16-month Bachelor of Education program called "Parcours français", a French Pathway to become a teacher in French immersion, Core French or French school.

Market yourself to employers by reflecting on your UBCO experience and identifying the skills and knowledge you developed through the activities you participated in. Meet with a Career Development Specialist for help with your resume, cover letter, and job search strategy.

Schedule an appointment with an advisor the term before you plan to graduate to ensure that you will meet all academic graduation requirements.
